

Remembering loved ones

November is traditionally a time of remembrance both on a national level and also in the Church, when we remember loved ones who have died.

Each year at the Cathedral we hold a service especially to remember those who have died during the past year, as well as those whose loss is more distant.

This year the service takes place on Sunday 3 November at 3.30pm in the form of a Choral Eucharist. During the service the Chelmsford Singers and members of the Cathedral Choir will sing movements from a setting of the Requiem by David Briggs.

The music (for choir, organ, flute, and oboe) is beautiful, colourful, and moving, and sets the traditional texts that reflect on life, death, loss and our confidence in the promise of eternal life.



Everyone is welcome to attend to remember a departed loved one, or to bring with them someone who would like to remember someone dear to them.

Cards will be available on which to write the names of the departed, and they will be placed on the altar during the service.

Study Notes on the Sunday Gospel

Readings for the Feast of St Cedd (27 October):

Jonah 3: 1-5
Psalm 87
Matthew 9: 35-end

Our readings today remind us of the importance of evangelism and discipleship, and that it is a primary duty of our Christian inheritance that we do all we can to make God's love and presence known in the world. No mistake then, that these are readings chosen for the celebration of one of our Patron Saints, St. Cedd. He was a missionary Bishop to the East Saxons, and landed at Bradwell on Sea all the way from Lindisfarne, where he built the famous St. Peter's Chapel, on the site of the old Roman wall in 654.

The readings remind us though, that spreading the Gospel isn't always easy, as St. Cedd found to his cost, more than once having to evade capture and death from the unfriendly, pagan natives! Jesus warns his disciples that the harvest is plentiful, but the labourers are few, and we know what Jonah did the first time he was requested to go and preach at Nineveh; he ran away! So St. Cedd's example of patience, determination and not a little faith should be an inspiration to us, who often have to face hostility and indifference today because of our willingness to stand up and be counted for God.
