St Cedd's School is an independent day school for boys and girls from Pre-School to Year 6 based in Chelmsford. The school is a member of the Choir Schools Association and it has close links with Chelmsford Cathedral. We are very proud that there are a number of St Cedd's School pupils who have been Choristers in the Cathedral Choir. Both the St Cedd's School Junior Chamber Choir and Senior Chamber Choir sing Evensong at Chelmsford Cathedral each term.

Music is an important part of daily life at St Cedd's School. All pupils sing, Year 2 pupils onwards learn to play the recorder, and there are currently in the region of 140 instrumental lessons which take place each week (taught by our brilliant team of visiting teachers).

Each week our Chamber Choirs, String Orchestra, Wind Band and other groups provide training in ensemble performing, help pupils to improve their listening skills, and let them gain a sense of fulfilment through making music with others. Currently we have pupils studying for Grade 7 and 8 Recorder and pupils who are members of the Essex Young People's Orchestra and the National Children's Choir of Great Britain. A number of pupils have also been awarded Music Scholarships or Music Awards this year in preparation for their entry into Secondary Schools in September.

Today's concert gives us a chance to showcase some of the best music making from our ensembles and gives a selection of our Year 5 and 6 instrumentalists a wonderful opportunity to perform solos in this beautiful setting in Chelmsford Cathedral.
